2. A really cool story The boy who came out of the cold

A schoolboy who spent the night trapped in a butcher's cold store after being locked in accidentally ran on the spot for ten hours to stay alive.

Peter Emerson, aged 15, was locked in the store in a Stratford-upon-Avon butcher's shop for 14 ½ hours, with the temperature around freezing point.

Staff arriving for work at the Wood Street shop found him yesterday morning, his teeth chattering and his face purple with cold. Still freezing, Peter immediately telephoned his parents who had reported him missing to the police.

Peter, who lives in Banbury Road, Stratford, said: „I help out at the shop after school and I had gone into the cold store just before closing time. I was behind a big food shelf when the door was locked behind me.”

„At first I thought someone was playing a joke but when I realised it wasn't and began shouting the staff had all gone home. I tried to kick the door open and to pick the lock but it was no good.”

„I was wearing only a shirt, trousers, a thin pullover and a white butcher's smock. It was bitterly cold and I realised that I might die, so I ran on the spot for about 10 of the 14 hours.”

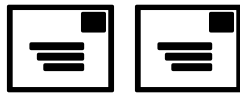

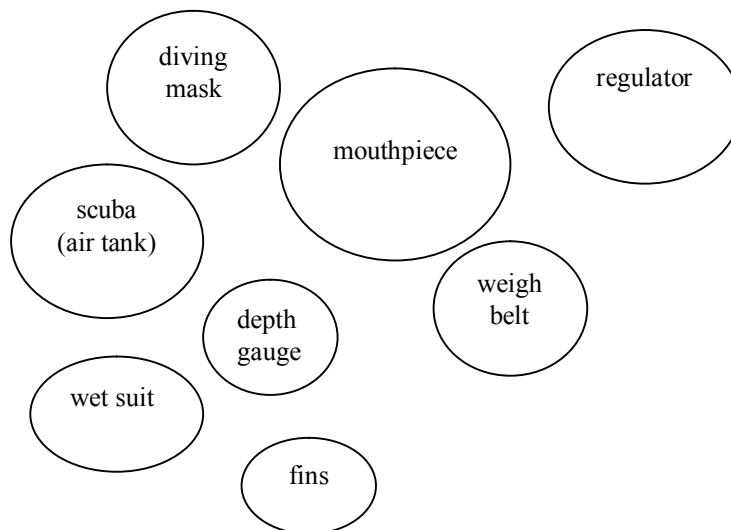
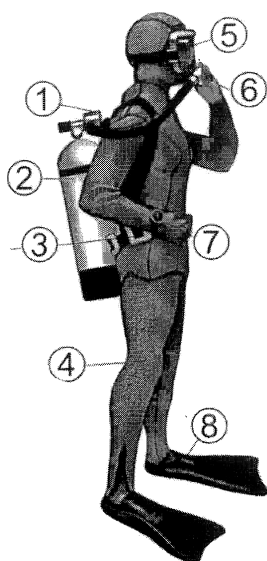
